Moore Project - 615 Healdsburg Ave.

Located at Healdsburg Avenue and Tenth Street, this project approved in 2002 finally broke ground in May of this year.



EAST ELEVATION

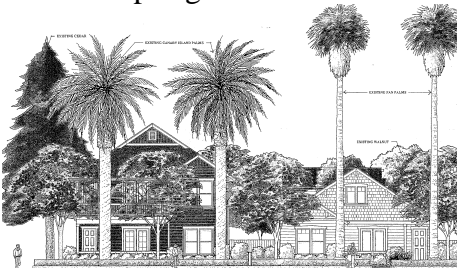
Museum Place – 514 B Street

This 2 story building will have five townhouses with a retail building in front. Construction began earlier this year with a fall completion date targeted.



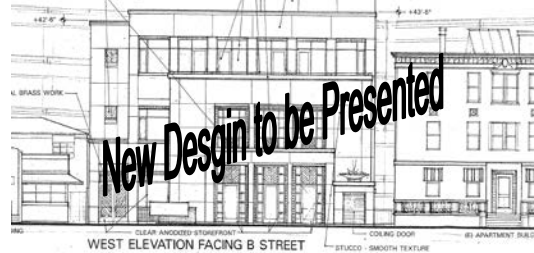
Empty Lot – 10th & Washington Sts.

The applicant (CARCO Investments) is still going through the City's permitting process. If this process is not completed soon, the project won't break ground until the Spring of 2006.



Office Building – 528 B Street

The applicant, Morrison Karsten Group, has redesigned the 3-story office building (to replace the current 1-story) and will be presenting the new design at our neighborhood meeting.



Northern Downtown Linkage Project

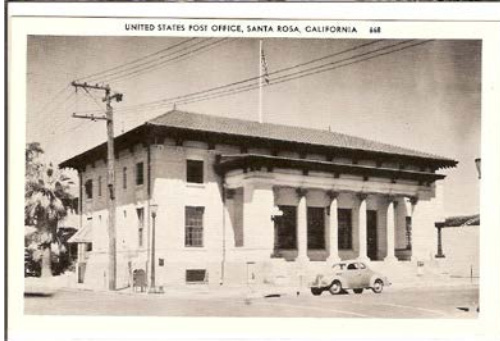
The goal of this project is to create a bicycle and pedestrian path from 7th Street west to the Prince Memorial Greenway at Pierson Street.

Building Profiles Sonoma County Museum 425 Seventh Street

Built during Santa Rosa's recovery from the 1906 earthquake, this building was originally the City's Post Office and is one of the few remaining examples of Classic Federal Architecture in California. The architecture of the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition held in Chicago opened the eyes of the people to the previously inferior quality of government architecture. As a result, the government hired James Knox Taylor as Supervising Architect for the US Treasury Department. It was this renowned architect who designed Santa Rosa's new post office. At the time of its construction, the building was considered one of the finest north of San Francisco. Originally located at Fifth and A Streets, the building was saved from demolition in 1979 when it was painstakingly moved (a process that took months) to its present location. Shortly thereafter it became the home of the Sonoma County Museum.

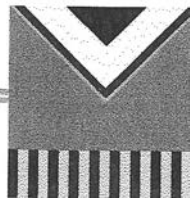
El Dia De Los Muertos La Ofrenda

The public is invited to a presentation and idea sharing meeting on The Northern Downtown Pedestrian Linkages project. This project is a study of the Sixth and Seventh Street corridor between Pierson and E Streets. The Study will focus on improving the physical appearance of the corridor and examine ways to better integrate the corridor into the fabric of downtown. Study objectives include: strengthening linkages between the northern areas of downtown and central downtown destination areas; creation of an inviting, safe and attractive passage in conjunction with the underpass that will be created at Sixth Street when U.S. 101 is widened; removal of barriers to non-motorized forms of transportation; and improvement of linkages to existing and future transit facilities.
