### **Mural for 9<sup>th</sup> Street**

After 3 years of effort on the part of our neighborhood and the West End neighborhood, both the City and Cal Trans have given final approval to painting a mural on the 9<sup>th</sup> Street undercrossing to Hwy 101. Funded by \$5000 from the Community Action Board, the mural is a grape leaf design paying homage to the wineries in each neighborhood in the late 1800's and early 1900's.



These were the Metzger Winery in our neighborhood (located almost exactly where the undercrossing is today) and the DeTurk Winery in the West End. We hope everyone will be able to come help us paint! Watch for more details soon.






### **Sixth Street Connection**

Long-delayed plans to reconnect 6<sup>th</sup> Street under Hwy. 101 may get a jumpstart thanks to cost savings from widening along the highway. The City expects to complete the design review process by mid-September at which time the City would move forward with advertising the project for construction bids. Actual construction is expected to begin by late spring of 2012, weather permitting.

Currently, the underpass is a fenced-off patch of dirt with weeds growing along the edges and graffiti adorning its walls. When completed, it will have bike lanes, sidewalks, pedestrian lighting, and crosswalks. Completing the underpass should also improve traffic flow through the area.

Built in 1914, this home was legally converted to a duplex many years ago.






**416 Lincoln Street - \$324,900 – MLS #21119071**

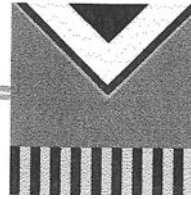
