Amgen Bicycle Tour

Get your cow bells ready! The Amgen Tour of California returns to three-time race champion Levi Leipheimer's hometown of Santa Rosa for the sixth time in its seven years of existence. Drawing the world's top cyclists, including Tour de France competitors, Olympic medalists, and world champions, the Amgen Tour of California is one of most anticipated professional cycling races on the international calendar.

Stage 1: Santa Rosa to Santa Rosa Sunday, May 13, 10:20am/3:45pm The first day of racing of the 2012 Amgen Tour of California will start and finish in Santa Rosa. The stage will start with two neutral laps downtown (3rd/4th Streets) before heading out through our neighborhood (8th/A Streets) to the open roads of Sonoma County. For the first time, the riders will race right to the finish line in Santa Rosa without any finishing circuits, ensuring a climactic, crowd-pleasing end to Stage 1 of the race. 
Traffic Diverter Facelift




Sixth Street Undercrossing Project starts in May

Santa Rosa is finalizing plans to complete the undercrossing on Sixth Street. The project is anticipated to take 26 weeks, with an estimated start date of May 14, 2012. Once completed, it will create a critical link for pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles to the downtown area and Railroad Square Historic District, transit mall, and SMART station.

Project Description:

This project will construct the roadway, curb and gutter, ADA sidewalks, pedestrian scale lighting, bike lanes, traffic signal improvements, and striping necessary to complete the undercrossing on Sixth Street (between Davis and Morgan Streets). The main portion of the undercrossing (the bridge, excavation, abutments etc. to create the space under Highway 101), was constructed in June 2007 under as part of the Hwy 101 Widening.
